AFFIDAVIT OF PETITIONER UNDER PROVISIONS OF SEC. 3, ACT JUNE 25, 1910

THIS FORM TO BE USED IN EVERY CASE WHERE A PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION IS FILED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 4 OF THE ACT OF JUNE 29, 1906, AS AMENDED BY THE ACT OF JUNE 25, 1910. IT SHOULD BE MADE IN DUPLICATE, IN THE OFFICE OF THE CLERK OF COURT, AND A COPY THEREOF ATTACHED EACH TO THE ORIGINAL AND DUPLICATE PETITIONS.

This is required of the petitioner by that portion of section 4 which provides that "The petition shall set forth \* \* \* every fact material to his naturalization and required to be proved upon the final hearing of the application." The clerk of the court should alter the fifth assertion on the petition to show that the alien does not declare his intention and add immediately thereafter, "but submits affidavit annexed setting forth the grounds for the exemption claimed."

To the Circuit Court of Kenosha County, Wisconsin

The affidavit of Charles Herrmann hereby filed, respectfully shows:

FIRST.—On the date indicated immediately below I was informed by the following-named person or persons that I was a citizen of the United States.

~~It is so long ago that I don't remember but I supposed my father~~  
(Date as near as known.)

~~was a full citizen of the United States and that made me one.~~  
(Here state the name or names of affiant's informants, their occupation at the time such information was given, address at that time, and present address, if known.)

(If the affiant knew he was not a citizen, but believed he could become such without a compliance with the general requirements of the naturalization laws, he should state the steps he thought it necessary to take, and the reason for his impression.)

SECOND.—I continued to believe as above indicated until the date shown below when I became apprised under the following circumstances that my impression was erroneous.

~~Until the spring of 1914. When I went to vote they asked me and after investigating I could not find that my father had second papers.~~  
(Date.)

THIRD.—I have exercised the following rights or duties of a citizen of the United States:

~~Voted, Jury and acted as road commissioner.~~

(This statement should include dates, and all pertinent facts. (If the affiant has held public office, served on jury, voted, or proved up on public land, all the particulars should be set forth.)

The aforesaid affiant, being duly sworn, deposes and says that he is the petitioner in the petition for naturalization No. 655, in the above-entitled court; that he makes the foregoing affidavit a part of said petition for naturalization; that he has read the said affidavit and knows the contents thereof, and that the same is true to the best of his knowledge and belief.
